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1. INTRODUCTION



Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) has conducted every year in Soma Subhadramma Raman Goud Arts and Commerce College for Women, Raichur to monitor and analysis the students' perception about Teaching –Learning and institution performance, infrastructural and welfare. Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS) was conducted among the students of 10 Departments of the institution. The students were informed to submit the feedback forms in google form <https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSeK0PEdcx0dQ6M9pLgqjaCcBMioi9vD4MZI5YziO6BeQ-pnYA/viewform?usp=sf> link provided in various whatsapp groups. The feedback questionnaire was prepared in accordance with NAAC guidelines. Students have rated the questions in 4-point scale. Response was collected from 250 students out of 432 has responded to this survey and their response has recorded during the year. The data were tabulated and analysed. The most of students were rated all criteria as Good and agreed.

The Head of the departments are informed to concentrate and discuss the students need, based on the Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS) in the upcoming board of studies meeting and to modify the curriculum for the next academic year. This survey helps to upgrade the quality of process. This survey includes majorly the questionnaire recommended by NAAC. First twenty question is the objective type mostly concern with teacher communication, mentor response, ICT based education, Industrial visit, Internship etc., and last one question is getting suggestion from students to improve institution teaching learning process. The recorded student's response for this survey has analyzed using software which will aggregate the response and generate the score of student satisfaction survey.

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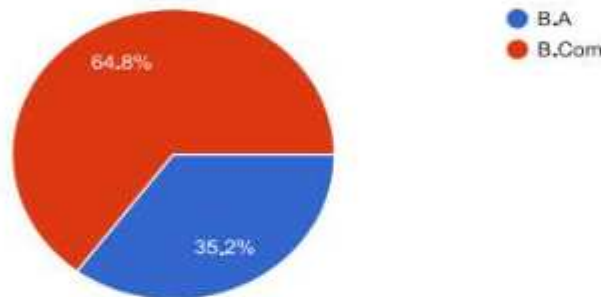

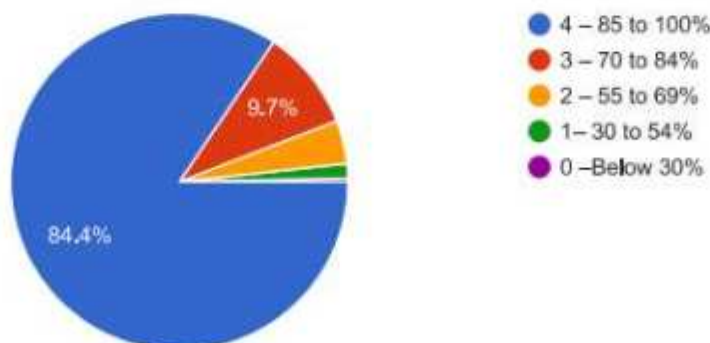


Most of the respondents were students from UG programme B.Com students are (64.8%) followed by B.A. (35.2 %) respectively.

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289 responses



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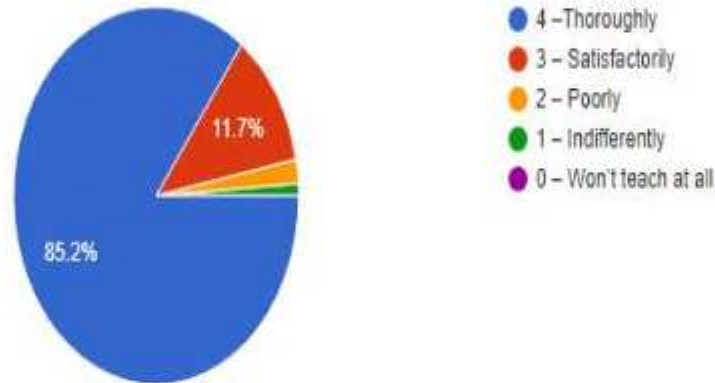

An almost equal number of respondents shared that the Teacher's preparation for classes was Thorough (85.2%) or satisfactorily (11.7%).


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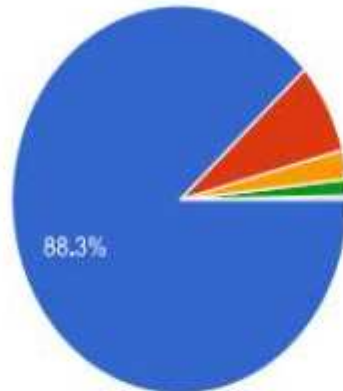

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3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?

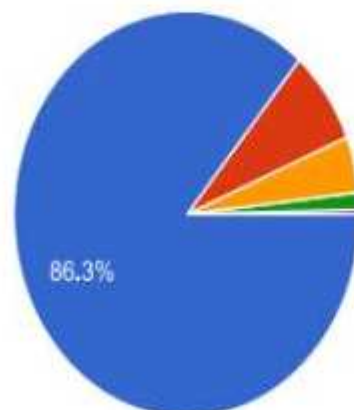


While more than 257 of the respondents shared that the teacher's ability to communicate was always effective (88.3%), many also shared that it was somewhat effective (7.6. %).

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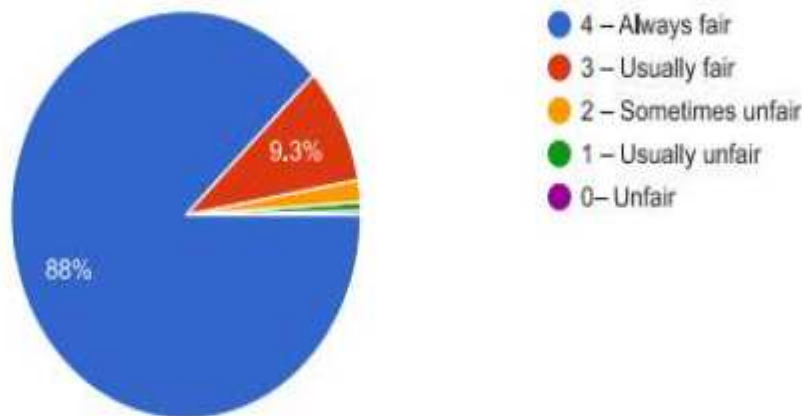
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Many students described the teacher's approach to teaching as excellent (86.3 %) for and Very Good (7.6 %), Good (4.5 %) and fair is (1.5%).

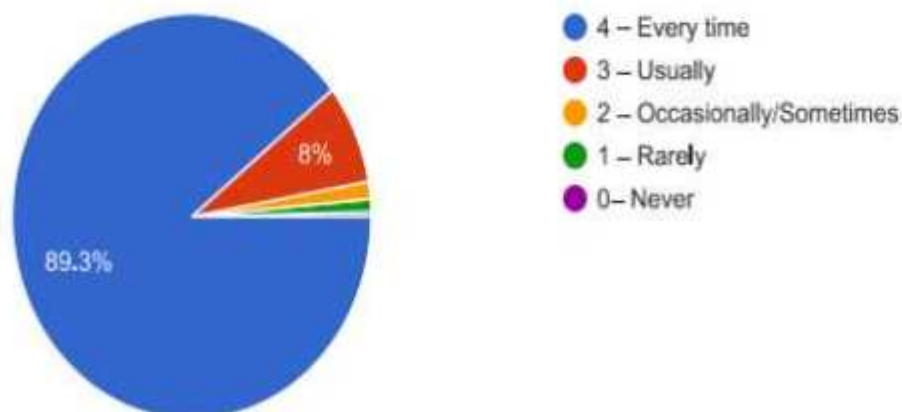


An almost number of respondents shared that the internal evaluation process was always fair (88 %) or usually fair (9.3%).

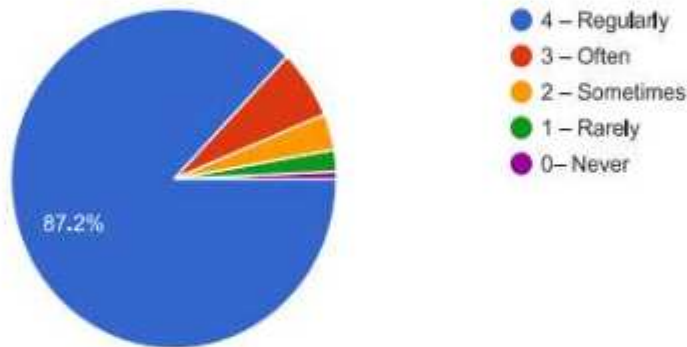

It is observed that 290 responses obtained from the student for the feedback on internship, student exchange and field visit for students 87.2% per cent.


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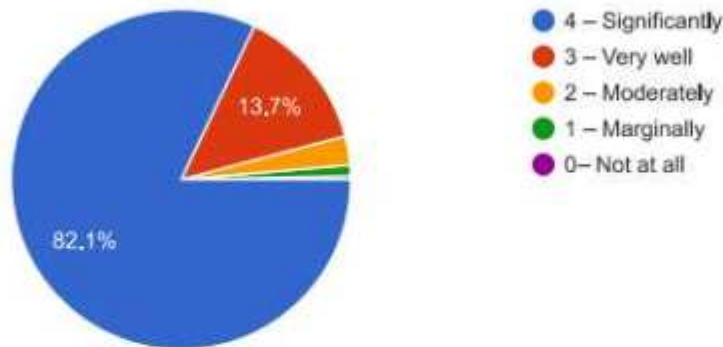

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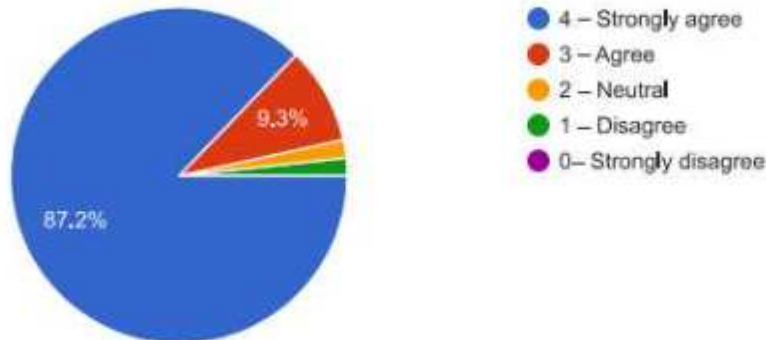

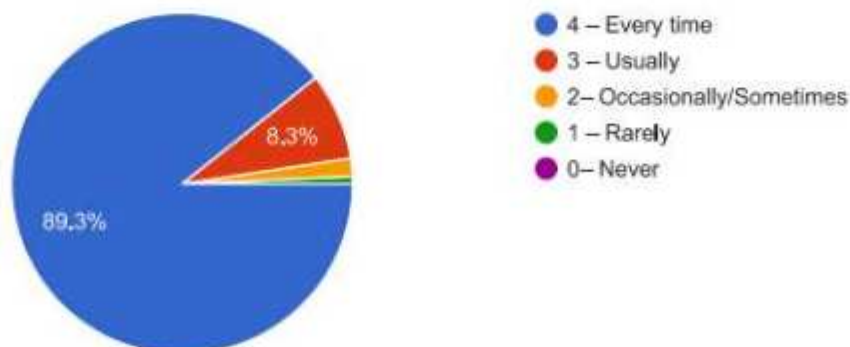

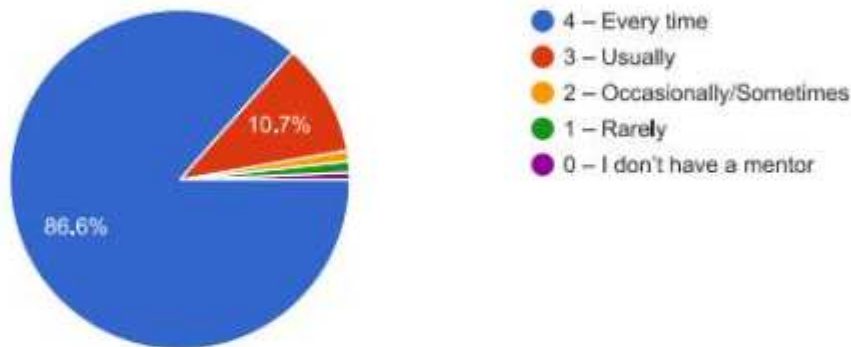

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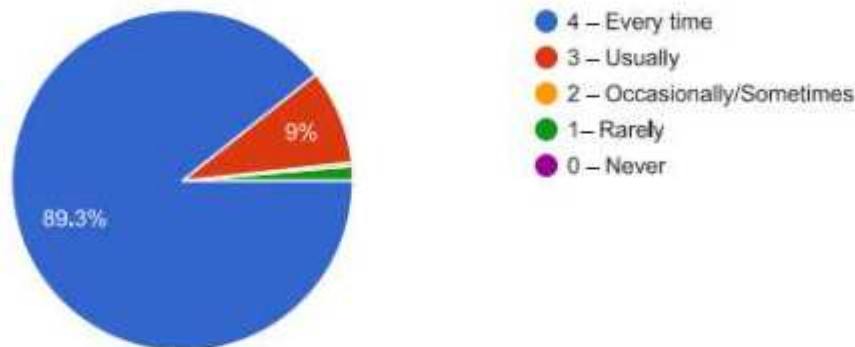

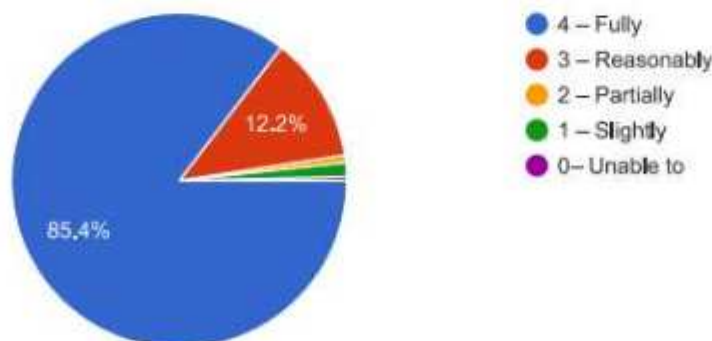

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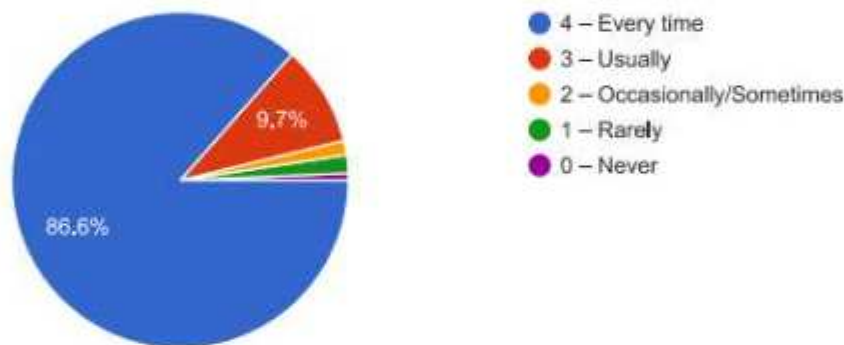

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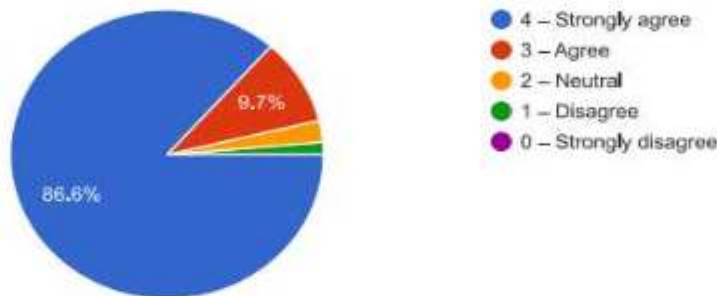

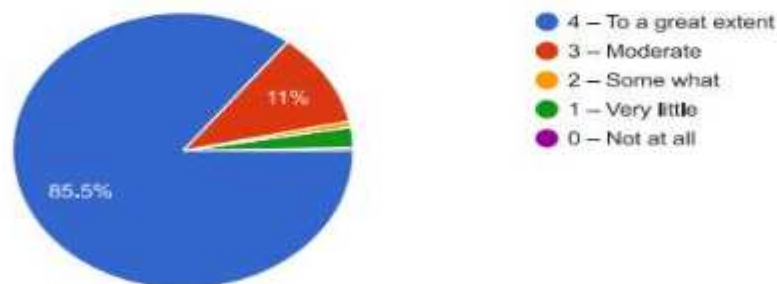

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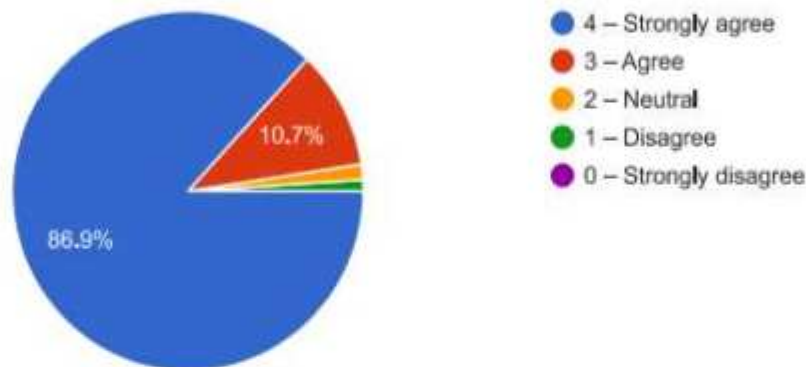

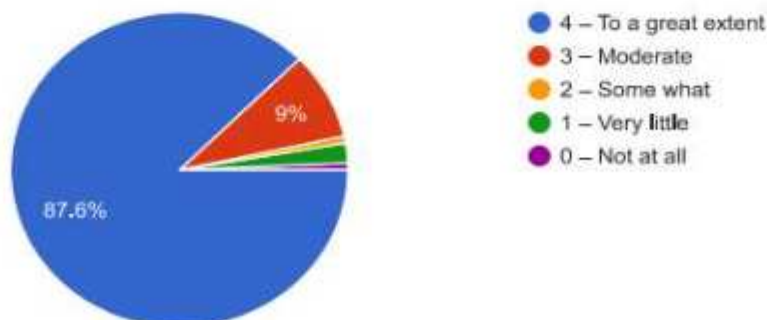

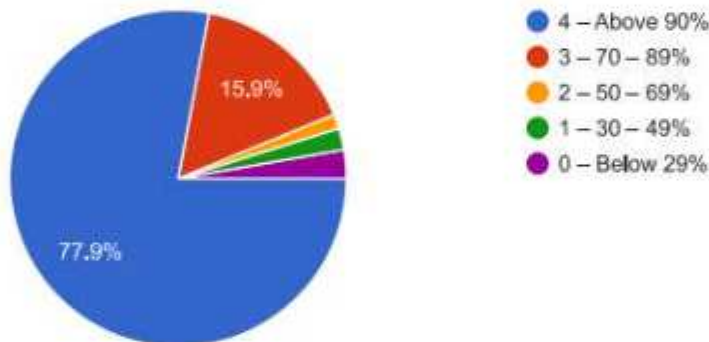

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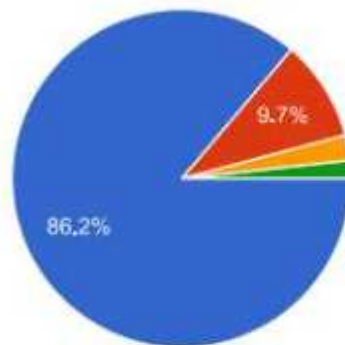
